According to Professor of English, Barbara Bontempo, Honorary Chair for 2014: "We know that if children are given the chance, the process of reading enables children to learn new words, to think new thoughts and take them places they have never been where they meet people whose lives may be very different from their own, and encounter ideas that may challenge their familiar way of life and build their capacity for understanding and empathy. And this is not limited to print. Words are more important than ever in navigating, with a critical eye, the seemingly limitless and random amount of information available on the Internet. Finally, and this may be a book's most valuable gift of all, children can escape into their imaginations and just read for pleasure; reading can be a positive "time-out" providing necessary relief from pain, stress (and for some children, from an atmosphere of fear or violence). Who knows what lives children may imagine for themselves through the magic of books? One thing is certain, without easy access to books, without books in their homes, in their after-school programs; children will be left bereft, and left behind."

"As a child, I was fortunate enough to have had a mother who encouraged me to read. At the age of four, my mother came to the United States from Russia, and although her formal education ended after first grade, she was always enamored with reading. She has read the complete works of Shakespeare and countless others. Because of her, and my wonderful teachers in Chicago, I received direction and instruction that led me to realize how important reading was in helping a person prepare for so many of life's meaningful undertakings. I find it so unfortunate that many children aren't able to build a foundation of literacy, or love of reading, simply because they don't have books available to them.
